Divine Mercy and Saint Faustina. Sister Faustina was a young, uneducated nun in a convent of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Poland during the 1930s. She came from a poor family that struggled during the years of World War I. She had only three years of simple education, so hers were the humblest tasks in the convent, usually in the kitchen or garden. However, she received extraordinary revelations or messages from our Lord Jesus. Jesus asked Sr. Faustina to record these experiences, which she compiled into notebooks. These notebooks are known today as the *Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska*, and the words contained within are God's loving message of Divine Mercy. Though the Divine Mercy message is not new to the teachings of the Church, Sr. Faustina's *Diary* sparked a great movement, and a strong and significant focus on the mercy of Christ. Saint John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina 20 years in 2000 making her the "first saint of the new millennium." Speaking of Sr. Faustina and the importance of the message contained in her *Diary*, the Pope called her "the great apostle of Divine Mercy in our time."

"Saint Faustina, you told us that your mission would continue after your death and that you would not forget us. Our Lord also granted you a great privilege, telling you to "distribute graces as you will, to who you will, and when you will." Relying on this, we ask your intercession for the graces we need, especially for the intentions we make. Help us, above all, to trust in Jesus as you did and thus to glorify His mercy every moment of our lives. Amen"

All intentions will be included in the weekend and weekday Masses (which will all take place in Tyrrellspass for now). First Communion and Confirmation. In light of the extended COVID-19 restrictions and the government's anticipated phased relaxation of restrictions throughout the course of the summer, all First Holy Communions are postponed until church services return to their normal schedule. Once restrictions are lifted, the priests will meet with school Principals to reschedule ceremonies possibly in the autumn. Likewise, Confirmation ceremonies will be reschedule by the Diocesan Office once restrictions are lifted.
